BLAST - 4th, 5th, 6th classes

As a follow on from last month's newsletter, our BLAST programme kicked off in 4th, 5th and 6th class on the 19th and 20th of December. Colum Kavanagh, our artist in residence, and comic writer, brought the BLAST programme, Bringing Live Arts to Students and Teachers, to Piercestown NS for the very first time. The children were so enthusiastic, particularly those with a special interest in this area! In the first workshop, Colm introduced the art of comic writing and talked to the children about the different genres and essential elements of storytelling. During the second session, the focus was on character development as he helped the children to come up with interesting ideas for characters. The children were then asked to draw their characters, including any special powers or items they will need in the story and to make notes on their personality. There will be three more sessions this term, Jan 13th, 20th and 27th and the hope is that by the end of the programme, the children will have produced their very first comic! Rumour has it, one of the first ideas to be brought to a student council meeting will be the option to create a 'Comic Book' Club that could run at lunchtimes!

'We are Writers'or we will be soon!

It is 2019 since our last 'We are Writers' book was published. 2023 will see our third ever book. This is a Scholastic production, that allows every child in the school to see a piece of their very own writing, published in a book! We will open a competition for the illustrator of the front cover, with Ms. Walsh giving us all this information at assembly today.
