We hope you all settle in at Piercestown N.S. and enjoy many happy school years with us. The staff at Piercestown N.S. would also like to take this opportunity to send their best wishes to 6th class of 2022-2023 as they are settling into their next chapter in secondary school.

Projected Enrolment – News**

With our school expanding and growing from year to year, we predicted that our staffing schedule (i.e. number of teaching staff) was due to increase in the school year 2024-2025 based on our numbers on roll on 30th September this year. However, the DES have a magic number for schools that grow quickly in a short space of time. We are delighted to announce, that as of Saturday Sept. 30th our school reached the 'magic number' to secure the 9th teacher back in November as opposed to having to wait until September 2024. This is amazing news for our school community. Normally, this teacher would be in a classroom and used to reduce a class size somewhere along the line, you may have heard some schools have a 'split class'. However, as we stand, already one room down, we have no room for this extra teacher. Therefore, we will use the teacher to offer team teaching in classrooms with larger populations to reduce pupil teacher ratio and thus further enhance the quality of teaching and learning. We are currently awaiting to hear from the Dept. if the panel for permanent appointments has cleared. If the panel is not clear, the school is

required to employ somebody from the panel. If the panel IS clear, the Board of Management will have the wonderful opportunity to go to open interview in the coming weeks for a new permanent staff member. This staff member will (all going to plan) be in situ by the time we return post midterm. As soon as we have news, you will be the first to know.

Upcoming Piercestown Parents' Association AGM – Date for your diary!

This Wednesday 11th October is the date that has been set in our diaries for the Parents' Association Annual General Meeting. Come along to hear all about our brilliant PA and their integral involvement in our school community. New members are always welcome. While we narrowly lost a close game against the formidable Shelmaliers to a last-minute goal, our determination shone through in the subsequent clashes. We bounced back with hunger, securing impressive victories against Oylegate and Barntown, showing that we never back down from a challenge and now move on to a quarter final Tuesday 10th October at 2pm in Rathangan.

Our rising stars have been shining brightly as well. Facing off against Rathangan, we experienced the highs and lows of competition, winning one game and losing another. But our young stars didn't stop there. With unwavering enthusiasm, they triumphed over the Shelmaliers, demonstrating their resilience and potential on the field.

In mini 7's unfortunately after two enthralling games against Kilmore and Kilrane in horrific conditions we were knocked out by Kilmore by a single score. All the boys got time to play and represented the school impressively. The lunchtime league finals taking place in the next few weeks plus a quarter final on the horizon it's a very exciting time for the GAA in Piercestown.

Sporting update from Ms Hearne

As we returned to school, it wasn't long before the chatter re Rackard League commenced. Only a week in and training kicked off in St. Martins pitch with all the girls from 5th and 6th in Murrintown and Piercestown coming together. 5th Class weren't the only new participants, we are also very lucky to welcome Ms Sheehan to our Rackard League team this year. With over 30 girls wanting to participate it quickly became clear that it was necessary to also enter in the Rising Stars competitions.

We began our Rackard League journey with a home game against Crossabeg, where we emerged as comfortable winners, having put in a great performance and with every player getting some game time. Next up saw us sending a mainly 5th class Rackard League team over to Glynn. Despite trailing by 2 points at half time, we emerged victorious by a goal. This was a great performance by many of our newcomers to Rackard League. Our first Rising Stars match saw us travel to Cushinstown. The girls showed their fighting spirit but were overpowered by a very strong Cushinstown side. We took on Castlebridge in our final group game of the Rackard League with Castlebridge having revenge in mind having lost out to us by a single point in the semi-final stage last year. It was a well fought game, with Castlebridge, with the aid of a strong wind, looking like the stronger team in the first half and we went in at half time 6 points down. In the second half we became accustomed to the higher standard and more than held our own and despite at one stage getting it back to only one score between the sides we couldn't bridge the gap and ended up losing by 5 points. We emerge from our Rackard League group in second place and qualify into the A quarter finals. The quarter finals have pitted us against Kilmore. This match will take place in Kilmore on Wednesday, 11th October. Unfortunately, qualification to the knockout stage of the Rising Stars competition was beyond us as we lost our final group game on Friday at home to Kennedy Park. It was a much-improved performance from first match with great work ethic on show and the improvement from game to game was really showing.

It has been great to see so many girls want to participate in the Rackard League and already we have seen us develop as a team and hopefully we can continue this journey and book our place in a semi-final.

Last Wednesday 13 girls headed off to Barntown to take on Barntown and Curracloe in round 1 of the mini 7's. They played Barntown in the first game and after a close first half the girls from Piercestown really hit their stride and proved themselves too strong. Curracloe, who also defeated Barntown, then stood in the way of progression to round 2. The girls had a great first half and lead by 2 goals at half time. A nervy few moments at the start of the second half ensued before they got a few more scores to ensure they booked their place in the next round.

We wish the girls the best of luck as these competitions enter the knock out stages. The skill and determination they have shown in the group stages and during every training session is commendable and we look forward to continuing to cheer these on in the hope of bringing another Rackard League or Mini 7's title back to Piercestown

Upcoming Elections for the Board of Management 2023-2027

As you may be aware, it is time for new Boards of Management to be put in place from December 1st. Before, I begin to briefly outline the constitution of the Board, I would like to formally thank the current Board of Management. While all Boards of Managements put in their time, the period from 2019-2023 was unique in that we experienced a global pandemic. This group of people, who volunteered to work on the Board of Management, went above and beyond to ensure the safety of our entire school community. They experienced face to face meetings, zoom meetings, late meetings, early meetings and many meetings above and beyond the normal remit. This was on top of all of the usual work by Boards of Management. Many thanks for all you do to ensure our school is the best that it can be.

A Board of Management is defined as: the body of persons or the person(s) appointed by the patron to manage the school on behalf of the patron.

A Board of Management comprises of eight people: two direct nominees of the patron, the principal of the school, one serving teacher on the staff, two parent nominees (one being a mother and the other being a father) and two extra members proposed by these six nominees. A governance manual of Board of Managements 2023-2027 outlines the role and responsibilities of the Board along with detailed outlines on the process and procedures. An Aladdin will be circulated in the next day or so about the procedure for the election of the parent nominees. I am also going to speak about the upcoming election of the Board of Management at the AGM this Wednesday.

Agreed report from the Board of Management meeting Oct 3rd.

The Board meeting took place on October 3rd and the following was the agreed report:

- The Board of Management wishes to welcome back all members of our school community, pupils, families and staff. A special welcome to all the new faces to our school.
- The annual review of the Child Safeguarding Statement took place and the Board has adopted without modification, the Child Protection Procedures for Primary Schools (revised in 2023).
- The Antibullying policy review was completed and conducted in accordance with the Dept. checklist as outlined in the Anti-Bullying Procedures for Primary schools.
- The Critical Incident Policy for the school year 2023 2024 has been updated and ratified.
- The Board of Management continues to work on the progress of the modular build.
- Elections of the new Boards of Management will take place in accordance with the guidelines in the coming weeks. Information around the election of parent nominees will be relayed in the coming days.
- The Board of Management welcomes new initiative of Reading Recovery this year as part of the SET.
- The Board of Management welcomes the return of the 9th mainstream teacher under projected enrolment for the school year 2023 2024. The recruitment of this position will take place as soon as the Dept. of Education has given the official go ahead.

It is hard to believe that this is my tenth year at Piercestown National School. In ways it feels much shorter and yet so much has changed. Our journey as an inclusive school and a place for everyone in their local community continues to grow and flourish and our aspiration to continuously enhance our physical resources continues too. We have gone from having a spare classroom back in 2014 to being at least one classroom short. I would like to thank the committee of Knockingall Community Centre for meeting me early in July and being so receptive of my request to source a suitable teaching space when time was against us in terms of the modular landing. being so receptive to change and supportive of our adaptations. I would like to offer the warmest of welcome to all our new families, we hope you have many enjoyable years with us over the next eight years.
